



What An Amazing Year at KARMA Rescue

We are preventing pets from entering the sheltering system in the first place. It was a bold move when we pivoted from rehoming pets out of area shelters to preventing pets from entering the sheltering system in the first place by focusing on pet retention.

Today, we have helped more pets and their families in one year than at any other time in our 20-year history: 1,797!

We have a dedicated team literally answering the cries for help for the parvo pup, the bestie hit by a car, and the senior kitty with a mouth so painful she can no longer eat. **Our Get Fixed program has** provided free spay/neuter to so many pets, 1,480! There's now a comma in our yearly number. And this is being accomplished despite the scarcity of veterinarians to keep up with the demand.

A handwritten thank you note. An email filled with emojis. A testimonial that will bring tears to your eyes. KARMA Rescue has been a beacon of hope during times of uncertainty. And we have found hope in the ongoing commitment from our dedicated supporters. And in the newly-formed partnerships with other organizations to positively impact the most lives. As a community.

We have learned so much in the past year – about our organization, the dedication of our supporters, the willingness of communities to lean in, and of course, the pets and their people and how this bond emphasizes our immense capacity for compassion and hope.

2021 Goal Recapped

2021 was a busy year. COVID was still impacting our communities and the need for pet support had reached epic proportions. With the help of our incredible supporters, we created a better future for pets and their families who love them. We proudly reached all our 2021 goals.

KARMA'S 2021 PROMISE WAS:

- Doubling the number of spay/neuter clinics.
- Expanding our spay/neuter services outside of our monthly clinics.
- Going into more under-resourced communities.
- Expanding our reach for medical assistance to pet families.
- Increase our veterinarian partnerships.
- Offering training assistance and education and building our relationships with community animal shelters and other non-profits in our targeted areas.

PROGRAM UPDATES 2021

Get Fixed: We helped, 344 families get their beloved pets spayed or neutered.

Project Coco: We succeeded in keeping 206 pets and their families together. Services included dog training, veterinary assistance, and microchipping.


WHY DOES KARMA RESCUE EXIST?

KARMA exists to catalyze a movement whereby healthy, humane communities become the norm: social change through promoting collective welfare for all.




GET FIXED PROGRAM

Our Get Fixed program offers low/no-cost spay/neuter services to families within targeted, low-income geographic areas of Los Angeles County. We work with a network of veterinary partners to provide low/no-cost spay/neuter surgeries. "Too Many" continues to be one of the top reasons for surrendering a pet to a shelter.



KARMA Rescue has partnered with the City of Palmdale's spay/neuter program.

Residents served by the incorporated City of Palmdale in zip codes 93550, 93551, 93552 and those assisting the community cats (TNR) in these areas can apply and receive low-cost spay/neuter services.






KARMA CARE PROGRAM






KARMA CARE CONT.








VOLUNTEERS


















THEY NEEDED HELP

At KARMA, our promise is to do everything in our power to keep families and pets together.

Nathan was living in his small RV with 16 cats and kittens and a dog. They were more than pets; they were his family. And they needed help. Several of the cats and kittens were suffering from diarrhea and other symptoms of a potentially life-threatening illness. Nathan was scared, overwhelmed and desperate. That's when he called KARMA to come to the rescue.



Thankfully, we were able to provide the necessary treatment. The cats responded well, but the two tiniest kittens, Angel and Bubbie, were still in critical condition, teetering on the brink of death.




Through our KARMA Care Program, Angel and Bubbie were admitted to a veterinary emergency clinic. Subcutaneous fluids were given, as well as critical antibiotics. Soon, they were back to their playful selves.

In the process of working with Nathan, we realized that his kittens and dog were never fixed. Through KARMA's Get Fixed program, we

remedied the situation by scheduling and paying for all the procedures.

Then the unexpected happened. Nathan's RV was totaled in a hit-and-run accident. Now he had to worry about where to live with his pet family. He knew he needed to make some changes. If not for him, at least for his pets.

With ongoing KARMA support, Nathan has been able to re-home all but nine of his cats. Spikey, the dog, will remain by his side. Even Nathan got re-homed! Happily, situated, he has his own apartment. He is reclaiming his life and surrounding himself with a new tribe. Hopefully, he won't need our services again. But if he does, KARMA will be there to help.





LOVE & NEEDED CARE

TO MANY, CAPTAIN is "just a dog." But not to Gina and not to KARMA.

This three-year-old boy had suffered through some hard times. His tail was broken. He was growing thinner by the day and battling digestive issues. Rumor has it he had been abused in his previous life. Enough was enough. Gina and her husband couldn't stand by and watch Captain decline any longer.

This compassionate duo was able to assume guardianship of Captain.

They knew he deserved better. Captain deserved to live a healthy, happy life.

Although they faced their own challenges, they had plenty of love to give!



As Captain settled in with his new family, it was evident he wasn't digesting his meals properly. And he continued to lose weight. Gina knew they needed to Captain to the vet. Then she found KARMA. We got Captain his full exam, including bloodwork and x-rays. His tail might need to be amputated at some point if it continues to cause him problems. But for now, he is on a special diet


and can maintain his weight. He thinks he is a lap dog—all 75+ pounds of him. He loves his doggie sibling. And, of course, he loves his new parents.


At KARMA, we understand that providing even "standard" veterinary care makes a big difference in the lives of pets in need and their families.


